All art is for sale and priced at \$50.00, so come down to the Arts Centre and support our young people by visiting and purchasing their art.


EFTPOS AVAILABLE

MARTA BRASH

Marta Anna Monos was born in Budapest, Hungary.

During Marta's school years, art and music were her core subjects, gaining a bachelor diploma in music. Originally, she wanted to be a piano teacher but in a change of direction around 20 moved to interior design and weaving wool carpets for wall decoration.

Marta managed her interior design business for over 15 years in Budapest, tailor making wooden cabinets, small furniture, wool rugs, and wool wall hangings, selling all types of decorations for home decor and interior design. During this time Marta exhibited in three large Craft and Art Exhibitions in Europe – Munich (Germany)1985, Dijon (France) 1986, Milan (Italy) 1986. Marta moved to New Zealand in 2001 and started to work in wool sheds as a wool handler, achieving a certificate in merino handling whilst in this position. After starting work at the New World Supermarket in Gore as a checkout operator, Marta met her husband Robert Brash, who became her most devoted supporter, best friend and life partner, since meeting seven years ago.

In 2012 Marta finished her New Zealand Interior Design Diploma and started her home staging business The Nest.
